Sermon Sketch: Today, our Greatest Hit has been a favorite of God's people for a few millennia. When we wait on the LORD, He will cause us to rise above the storms of life ...

- 1) How was Communion meaningful to you last week? How as feeding on heavenly bread, and drinking from a heavenly cup empowered your life? (SGH #12 Heavenly Food and Drink, 1 Corinthians 11:23-34, 5/5/24)
- 2) Have you ever watched an eagle in flight? Have you ever seen them swoop down and capture their prey? Why might eagles be a symbol in Scripture of military prowess and victory?
- 3) There are a number of musical settings to this verse of Scripture – which is your favorite?
- 4) How does the fact that our Lord does not grow faint or weary (Isa. 40:28) relate to our ability “run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint” (31)?
- 5) In what ways do you choose to wait on the Lord
- 6) (Psalm 25:5, 27:14 and 37:34)?
- 7) In what ways do you have still more to learn about waiting (Psalm 86:11 and 143:10)?
- 8) How does the Holy Spirit enable you to rise again after having a fall (Proverbs 24:16, Micah 7:8)?

- 9) Are you able (James 1:2) to see the storms of life as an opportunity to rise (Ephesians 2:6, Colossians 3:1)?
- 10) When and where has Jesus calmed (Mark 4:39) the storms of your life? Having calmed them in the past, how does that build your faith to face the storms of this present moment?
- 11) Have you ever experienced the supernatural supply of God that He pours out in the midst of ministry expenditure?
- 12) How has God caused you to run and not grow weary and to walk and not faint?
